Emergency Shelter:

- For homeless women & children who are program participants.
- Meals, transportation assistance and comprehensive case management services are also offered.
- Open 24 hours a day, seven days a week

- Intake hours: 10 a.m. - 5 p.m., 7:30 p.m. - 10 p.m.
- No documentation required.
- Requirement: homeless and willing to work program.

Bethany Place Program:

- For individual women who need supportive housing and case management after incarceration for non-violent crime, completion of substance abuse program, or upheaval related to domestic violence or physical or mental health issues.

- Intake hours: 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. weekdays
- Requirement: Appropriate and willing to work program.

Family Shelter Partnership Program:

- Partner agencies include: Bethany House, Interfaith Hospitality Network, The Salvation Army, The Anna Louise Inn, Mercy Franciscan at St. John, and the YMCA Battered Women's Shelters.
- Access: Through a telephone call to one of the participating shelters

Bethany Homes:

- Provides safe, permanent, affordable rental housing for 24 families. Facility has community center, picnic grove, playground and parking lot.

- Requirements: Police & credit check, income verification and other standard rental housing paperwork.

Nurse/Home Care Aide Training Program:

- Individualized training and support for unemployed or underemployed women.

- Intake hours: July 1 - August 15 for September class; January 5 - February 28 for spring class.
- Requirements: face-to-face interview with staff as part of acceptance into program, police check and references required, must pass pre-test assuring grade 6 literacy and math skills
- \$200 fee is required; payment plans available.

Social Services (emergency assistance)

Requirements for Service: income eligibility (per each funding source); proof of income; proof of residence for all claimed household members; picture identification

Holiday Season Assistance (adopt-a-family type program)

Requirements for Service: adopt-a-family type program, general hardship; emergency situation (fire, loss of job, etc.); referral from partnering organizations; having had received service through one of the agency's programs during the year

Food, Clothing, Personal Care Items

Requirements for Service: need based – determined through initial intake process (see Social Services)

Sandwich Window

Requirements for Service: need Service hours: 1:00 - 3:00 p.m.



Fans/Air Conditioner

This program supplies fans and air conditioners to those in need. Fans are available to all. Air conditioners are available to individuals who provide a medical statement of need. Priority for air conditioners is given to individuals with chronic illnesses and to households with elderly and children.

Pre-Employment Training (computer skills)

Requirements for Service: 18 years of age or older; economically disadvantaged; hold a high school diploma or GED

Youth Development Programs

Requirements for Service: young men and young women ages 9-17; parental consent; referrals taken from schools & recreation centers; at-risk because of hardship, single parent home, discipline problems, etc.

Temporary Housing

Requirements for Service: homelessness - This program provides clean, safe, temporary housing for two-parent and single parent families. During their 30 to 60 day stay, homeless families and children receive case management and assistance in managing finances, family counseling, childcare referrals, and more. Bus tokens, funds for gas and laundry, along with other support are available, if needed.

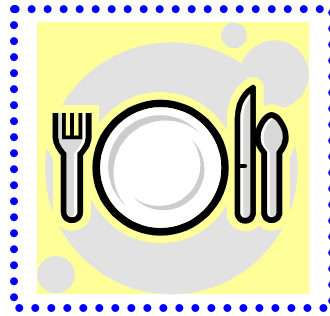
- Birth Certificate/ID's:** As available Documentation needed. One time per year.

- Visiting Nurse:** Blood pressure and diabetes monitoring, referrals. Mon.10:00am – 12:00.

 - number of prescriptions that can be filled is based on availability.

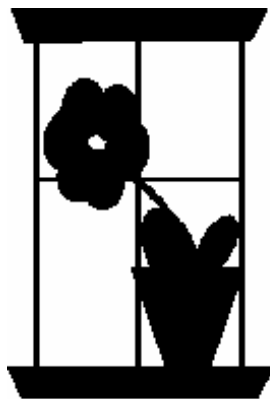

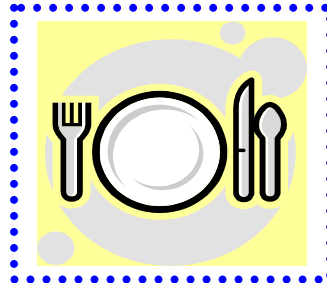
